Service We use *The Book of Common Prayer* (red) designated by BCP, followed by the page number.

Music Primarily we use *The Hymnal 1982* (blue). The bulletin has two hymnal references: # preceding a number refers to a hymn. # S preceding a number is for music within the service other than a hymn, such as the Sanctus at the Eucharist and located at the front of the hymnal. Our other hymnal is *Wonder, Love, and Praise* (green) in which there is no division of service music and hymns, so all bulletin references use only #.



THE FIRST READING

ACTS 1:15-17, 21-26

In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred twenty persons) and said, "Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus—for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry. So one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection." So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed and said, "Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place." And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles.

I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world.
